Dental care

We see lots of bad mouths. Like humans, our pets deserve the best dental care and regular cleanings. Bacteria in the mouth go through their intestinal track and can cause serious illness such as heart disease, kidney disease, and not to mention the pain and discomfort they have with all the plaque, tartar built up and gingivitis. It is very common that most dogs act like puppies again after a dental procedure. TLC Grooming strongly recommends to feed your dog T/D (a dental diet made by Hill's Pet Nutrition) and if your dog likes to chew, to give CET HEXTRA CHEWS. The chew contains Chlorhexidine which controls bacteria in the mouth for 24 hours. Both these products are only available at your veterinarian. My 11 year old Trixie only had ONE dental her whole life. We use both these products. Unfortunately it will not fix an existing problem, but are great tools in prevention.

Nail trims

Most dogs hate nail trims, but it has to be done at least every 4-6 weeks. Long nails cause feet to splay and it is painful for you the dog. This is one of the medical reasons we groom our pets. No need to make an appointment, call ahead.

Long hair vs. short hair during winter time

The longer the hair, the more it will protect your pet against the cold. The downside with longer coats is to maintain it and to prevent matting. Grooming is recommended every 3-6 weeks.

Shaving pads totally clean during our brutal cold winters is not recommended. The hair does protect the pads when they go outside, BUT ice can get stuck and cause severe discomfort. Buying boots is the way to go!
